Homework

Homework will focus on reading, spelling, times tables and the related division facts. The children need regular opportunities to practise these skills and develop individual strategies that best suit them and their learning styles.

Literacy and Numeracy in Year 4...

Writing: We will be reading the 'Best Part of Me' and creating our own poetry in a similar style, we will also be reading 'Voices in the Park' and learning how to write from a different point of view. We will use connectives to extend our sentences, learn how to use pronouns effectively, and develop our use of figurative language to add interest to our writing. We will also continue to develop a handwriting style that is neat and joined.

Reading: The children are encouraged to read 'real' books and are asked to select books they're interested in and to read these regularly making their own comments in their reading records focusing on different reading skills.

Maths: This term there will be an emphasis on number, place value and addition. We will practise our mental calculations and multiplication facts which will help us calculate more efficiently. We will also continue to develop our use of formal written methods and continue to investigate different ways to solve problems using prior knowledge.
