

Monday	<p>1. PE with Joe This can be done live at 9:00 or saved until later in the morning.</p>  <p>2. Reading See if you can read: Our new poem - 'My Puppy'. How many special friends can you see?</p>	<p>Phonic sound: 'y' (makes an 'ee' sound at the end of words) Have a look at the 'y'  pictures and see if you can write a list of things that make you 'happy'. (see download)</p>	<p>Art Have a look at this artist https://megancoyle.com/ and then see if you can make a collage of an animal using torn strips of paper from old magazines or newspapers. You could make an animal from 'What the ladybird heard' – lots of the pictures in this book have a collage effect.</p>
Tuesday	<p>Keep practising your sight words.</p> <p>Watch or read if you have it: 'What the ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7NbyiDpY6Ww</p> 	<p>English What the Ladybird Heard See if you can spot some adjectives (describing words) in the story. Lots of adjectives have a 'y' sound at the end. Choose 2 of the animals and see if you can think of some other adjectives to describe them.</p>	<p>Computing Take a photo of an animal and its habitat (where it lives) you have seen when enjoying the outdoors. See if you can zoom in to see it up close.</p>
Wednesday	<p>3. Maths Watch the video lesson for the day on White Rose Maths (start with Week 1: Weight and Mass)</p>	<p>Science - Animals We are going to be learning about all sorts of animals. Have another look at 'What the Ladybird heard' and see if you can find some mammals (animals that have fur) and birds. I think there is one</p>	<p>Food Technology Why not make some 'wibbly wobbly jelly' - look at it as it changes at different times in the process. Enjoy it with a scoop of ice cream.</p>

Thursday	<p>(This link will take you to Week 1 of the Summer Term, make sure you click on 'Week 1' just above to find the weight and capacity resources.) </p> <p>You could have lots of fun at home comparing the weights of things, use some scales, do some baking, make some playdough, guess how many cups your jug will fill, what if you filled egg cups?</p>	<p>English</p> <p>What the Ladybird Heard</p> <p>Choose one animal from the story and see if you can write a description of it. You mustn't tell me what the animal is, I will see if I can guess. Think about what kind of 'skin' it has, how many legs, how it moves.....</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>Make a map of a farm, a zoo, or a safari park. Think about the areas animals will need to live in and what their habitats will be like. Here's a good example: https://www.durrell.org/wildlife/visit/#park-map</p> 
Friday		<p>Phonics - y (as an ee sound)</p> <p>Have a look at the pictures (on resource sheet) and see if you can sort them. Some have an 'ee' or 'ea' or 'y'. Have a go at writing the words next to or under the pictures.</p> <p>(see downloads)</p> <p>(Coming soon!)</p>
