White Rose Maths



As a school we follow a Maths scheme called White Rose Maths. They have set up homebased learning activities for each year group. As you would expect, Reception's activities are often less formal than other year groups, but the maths is there! In Early Years, the focus is often on exploring mathematical concepts and using lots of mathematical language to provide a solid base for the more subject specific learning that takes place in later years. This week's activities are based on the book 'Supertato'. I have used this as a starting point for the other suggested home-based learning activities and provided links to the stories being read on you-tube.

Oxford Owl



As you know, we use the Oxford Reading Tree Read Write Inc scheme to support our literacy learning in Reception. They have a great range of e-books in their online library that you can access via the class log in that I have set up. Some books also have comprehension activities or games to play and often come with tips to help you get the best out of reading with your child. The site also offers you access to different activities such as colouring sheets and maths activities.
