Week Beginning: 18.5.20	Suggested Morning Activities and Skills	Afternoon
	<p>Theme: Jungle Fun</p> <p>Remember to complete your weekly activity counting chart every day and count the dots on a Friday.</p> 	
Monday	<p>Listen to the story, 'Walking Through the Jungle' read by Miss Young.</p> <p>Listen to the elephant rhyme by the Nursery Team. Join in with the actions!</p> <p>Listen to, 'Down in the Jungle,' song! Have fun joining in!</p> <p><u>Paint a picture of your favourite animal from the story.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Remember to think about making your picture detailed. Can you tell your family why it is your favourite? 	<p><u>Independent Activities to complete this week all by themselves!</u></p> <p><u>You could make up a box with independent activities in that your child enjoys so they can play by themselves while you do some work.</u></p>
Tuesday	 <p>Rumble in the Jungle: Lion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the lion poem – can you join in with it? Play a memory game with bits of paper or paper plates. This can be done with pictures, numbers or letters. Turn over 2 at a time – keep them turned over if they match 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Get dressed * Put shoes and socks on really quickly! * Complete a puzzle * Cut out some pictures from cards and magazines * Look for numbers/letters around the environment * Look at a book * Retell a story with puppets * Have a picnic with your teddies * Make a model from your construction toys * Make up a story with small world toys
Wednesday	<p>Happy Birthday Sophie! xxxx</p> <p>Rumble in the Jungle: Zebra</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the zebra poem – can you join in with it? Make a zebra pattern with either pen, paint or strips of black paper Ask a grown up to hide 10 objects/toys around the house and then go on a scavenger hunt to look for them. Can you tell the grown-up what sound they start with eg b for bear 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Look for numbers/letters around the environment * Look at a book * Retell a story with puppets * Have a picnic with your teddies * Make a model from your construction toys * Make up a story with small world toys
Thursday	<p>Rumble in the Jungle: Giraffe</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the giraffe poem – can you join in with it? Play Kim's Memory Game. Find 8 small items and put them on a tray with a tea towel over the top. Look carefully at them and then the grown up takes one away when you have your eyes shut tight! Can you say which one has gone missing? 	<p>Afternoons</p> <p>Please use the afternoons for exercise and visiting places in our beautiful island. You may be inspired for your, 'Beautiful Jersey,' creative project.</p>
Friday	<p>Jungle Music and Rhythm Fun!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the Nursery Teams song from the music room! Listen to the sounds/syllables of the animal names (attached on web site) Clap along to the syllables 1 clap for snake, 2 claps for monkey, 3 claps for crocodile, 4 claps for rhinoceros and 5 claps for hippopotamus You could use a drum, shaker or other instrument to sound out the syllables. <p style="text-align: center;">COUNT THE DOTS ON YOUR ACTIVITY COUNTING CHART.
