




French Home Learning

Numbers to 12		Use a pack of playing cards and play 'Play your cards right'. (Put 5 cards out in a line, turn the first one over and guess whether the next one is 'plus' or 'moins'. See if you can get to the end of the line)

An important part of French culture is that quite often, even small villages host a weekly market. This can turn quite small and seemingly quiet villages into a hubbub of activity. The French take great pride in producing a lot of their own food and the origin of the produce is shown.

Here are a couple of well known stories that you might enjoy. You will probably need to listen to them several times, over a few days.

Don't worry if you don't understand everything. The important thing is to listen out for 'key words' - in this case any fruit or vegetables.

They are stories you will know, so you could pause the video and use what you know of the story and the pictures to see how much you can understand.
