Teaching projects

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To provide quality feedback for children</p> <p>Activity: One to one consultations weekly 15 minutes with class teacher to provide quality feedback and conferencing.</p> <p>Cost: £20,000</p>	<p>Pupils will be fully aware of their strengths and next steps in order to improve their work across a range of subject area, as well as an improved attitude to learning. All pupils eligible for Jersey Premium funding are working at age related expectations or above. There is no gap between the achievement of pupils who are eligible for Jersey premium and those who are not.</p>
<p>Aim: To raise the quality of teaching and learning</p> <p>Activity: (OLEVI) Bespoke CPD programmes for all teachers. 6 teaching and learning sessions and post session follow ups, developing best practice across the school.</p> <p>Cost: £2,000</p>	<p>Teachers will become more reflective and creative, gaining a deeper understanding of the pedagogy that ensures pupils eligible for Jersey Premium funding make good progress.</p>
<p>Aim: To meet the needs of EAL learners</p> <p>Activity: EAL learning support assistant. All class teachers to receive CPD focussing on EAL learners, to ensure that all teachers understand the needs of EAL learners</p> <p>Cost: £5,000</p>	<p>Pupils identified as EAL do not fall behind their peers in reading, writing and maths. Class teachers have a greater understanding of EAL learners; quality of planning, teaching and learning reflects this.</p>

Targeted academic interventions

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To support language development</p> <p>Activity: Targeted support in Speech and Language using Wellcomm and Reading Response intervention programmes.</p> <p>Cost: £6,600</p>	<p>Pupils eligible for Jersey Premium funding do not fall behind their peers in reading and writing.</p> <p>Vocabulary of pupils eligible for Jersey Premium funding is in line with other pupils, evidenced in Wellcomm assessments.</p> <p>Pupils leave FS reaching age expected milestones in spoken language.</p>
Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To support social, emotional and mental healths of pupils</p> <p>Activity: Develop further the emotional understanding and response skills of pupils (ELSA).</p> <p>Cost: £5,000</p>	<p>Pupils who have undertaken ELSA sessions will have an improved self-efficacy, resilience, self-esteem and engagement with learning in class.</p>

Wider Strategies

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To provide extra curricular enhancement</p> <p>Activity: To prioritise children eligible for Jersey Premium funding in breakfast club and in extra curricular activities</p> <p>Cost: £1,400</p>	<p>Pupils eligible for Jersey Premium will be offered activities which promote an enriched curriculum, which is as broad and balanced as possible.</p> <p>Clubs will become more targeted with class teachers ensuring that all pupils eligible for Jersey premium have the opportunity to attend.</p> <p>Identified children feel nurtured and listened to in Breakfast Club and have opportunities for high level dialogue.</p>
