Flourish / Caring Cooks hot lunches

We are delighted to give you details of the expansion of the Government's commitment to providing subsidised hot meals to children. From 7th March, St Peter's will work with Flourish to offer hot lunches to children. You will need to register for an account in order to place your orders. Orders must be in place 7 days in advance but should be available for booking now for those who want to get organised. If your child is in receipt of Jersey Premium funding, your child will be eligible for free school meals, you will need to provide your Income Support letter to Caring Cooks. Details attached.
